The Elk County first responders will have a landing zone training on October 21, 2023 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Extension Building. Ms. Cordell has been working with the National Weather Service to get a threat matrix setup to keep up to date on the weather for the upcoming fall festival. ## Road

This will be paid out of the EMPG funds.

## Contract for Administrative Services

## Revised Interlocal Agreement
